There was a great deal of energy on the first floor of the middle school two days before students headed off for their winter break. All 7th and 8th grade students, administrators and teachers made their way to the PBL room for an exhibition of their projects.


Project based learning is a brand new course this year which focuses on developing skills through projects and authentic learning. In term 2, students researched, synthesized resources and pulled together knowledge from various core subjects on the theme of "conflict." Some student topics included the blurry line between what makes someone "normal vs. abnormal," the benefits and drawbacks of robots in the workplace, topics on how PE and Music's impact students, and everything in between.

Presentations were completed in 5 separate rooms simultaneously, which allowed students to select presentations on topics in which they were interested. Although nervous, students displayed confidence in their abilities and knowledge. Many teachers and administrators expressed excitement and pride at what students were able to do in such a short amount of time. Students too seemed to appreciate the opportunity to learn about a topic that they were invested in and passionate about.

In term 3, 4 and 5 students will be developing and executing projects around the theme of "making a better world". We encourage family and friends to join us when the students present these projects in late May (date TBD). Come see these students display their passions, hard work, and ideas!

KIMEA MS HONOR CHOIR FESTIVAL

On Thursday, January 19, ten CDS MS students attended the KIMEA MS Honor Choir Festival at Gyeonggi Suwon International School. The Festival had 150 students from 11 different Korean international schools come together and form two choirs. Our students were part of the Mixed Choir, which had all the other schools singing together. The students representing CDS included Daniel Hong, YeJune Kwon, Jieun Koo, Jinyu Ogura, Jiah Choi, Nayon Lee, Siena Lee, Lucy Seong, Ashley Shimada, and Yuna Um. These ten students were very diligent and put great effort in the months prior to the festival in order to have their parts memorized. The students sang three very different pieces and worked with three different conductors. The students sang a Latin piece called, "Kyrie", conducted by Ms. Van Liew, "Chapua Kali Desemba" conducted by the ISK Director, and "Why We Sing" conducted by the GSIS Director. The students had rehearsals in the morning, a dress rehearsal, and then performed in the afternoon. Sixth Grader, Jinyu Ogura, said, "There were many students and teachers we didn't know so it was good to cooperate with them, but at the same representing each of our unique and different schools". As Sixth Grader, Daniel Hong reflects on the Festival, he says, "It was a great experience and I learned a lot of things such as perseverance to singing skills with harmonies. I felt like all of the international schools were united as one. It is an experience that I won't forget."
