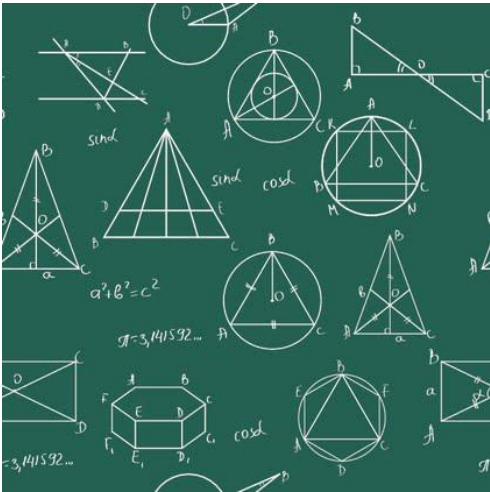

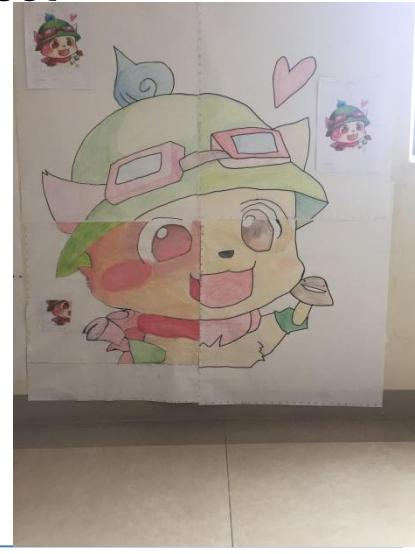

CDS MS 8th grade Math Project



For term 3, 8th grade students did their first group project in Geometry class. With this project, students explored the use of dilation, a transformation in which a figure is enlarged or reduced using scale factor. Each group chose an image to dilate and cut the image into equal pieces to participate equally. Once all the members in group have completed his/her dilated image, they put all images together to create larger dilated image. Grade 6 students turned blank spaces in CDS Middle School into looms to help learn the process of weaving. Each 6th grader created three weavings to be displayed as a group piece. Fiber art is a “genre” or type of fine art (painting, drawing, sculpture etc...) whose material consists of natural or synthetic fiber (yarn, string, hair, etc...). 6th grade art students also learned about yarn bombing, which is a type of street art or graffiti. A yarn bombing is form of street art where yarn in any form is attached to an object in the public environment much like graffiti and other street art. Yarn bombing is only temporary. It is meant to appear, make you think a little differently about surroundings, and then disappear. -Ms. Pantano
